Spring has brought another opening day, the golf course is in good shape for the opening this year, lots of elk damage to Fairways, these will hopefully fill in by the end of the year, we are filling holes as much as we can.

We continue to have lots of repairs to maintenance vehicles as well as fleet carts, mostly just battery's for our carts, and with our grounds equipment being older clutches are going, with that we should see our newer ones arriving in next couple weeks. We have been trying to fix drainage issues on the golf course this spring, so as not to have wet areas when we have rain days, we have replaced the old sewer pipe an installed the proper drainage tile in locations around the course.

The new tees that were done last fall should be ready for May 1 if all goes as planned, they received major elk traffic over the winter so we need to level them up as best we can.

Lots of questions on ladies 4 turn around , it will require a 3 point turn to exit it, this was done for safety reasons, it is no different then what was there before , but now has a better path , I foresee more people using the stairs then the actual cart path. Not much else to report this time around, the grounds staff continue to do an excellent job an strive to make the course better every day.

Except for online booking having some hiccups golfers have been booking tee times and getting some golf in. Our season officially kicked off at 10.30am on Friday March 28th.
- The Men's and Ladies leagues are preparing for the 2025 season. The golf course is in great shape for an early start, with minor elk damage being addressed daily.".

#### 6. Course & Operations Update

- Course Conditions: Course looks great and lots of positive feed back from members and guest on the conditions
- Driving Range Update: Member range pick went well with the collection of range balls in the area of about 20,000. Big shout out to all those who took the time to help. (Note this will in the April newsletter.
- Cart & Equipment Status: 5 new carts coming in will be advertising we have 5 old carts for sale. I do believe at this time we already have 2 spoken for.

#### 7. Key Notes & Action Items

- Important Reminders: Still working on getting members to drop in and say hi before going to the first tee. We now have put in place the use of the iPad after it being updated to make sure guests sign for power carts. This will also get used for checking pace of play.
- Recommendations & Next Steps: Will be placing another ad, now the golf season is going for Marshalls to patrol the course on busy days to check pace of play

#### **Closing Statement:**

Overall, March has been a positive month for the golf shop. Memberships are trending up but will have a better grasp by the end of April, and sales are strong with still some stock to come into the shop and with fitting days coming up in April. Looking ahead, we are preparing for the upcoming tournament season, leagues and group bookings.
